

# **Additional Diplomatic Governance Provisions**

## **Diplomatic Offices and Embassies**

In countries where HHIDM has entered into a bilateral treaty or other duly authorized diplomatic instrument, HHIDM may establish diplomatic offices, embassies, representative offices, cultural centers, sustainable centers, or administrative facilities in accordance with the provisions of the applicable treaty and local laws.

## **Ambassadors-at-Large**

HHIDM may appoint Ambassadors-at-Large to represent specific regions of the world.

An Ambassador-at-Large may oversee diplomatic activities, programs, communications, and coordination across multiple countries within an assigned region.

Ambassadors-at-Large shall report through the established HHIDM governance structure and shall remain accountable to the Constitution, Declaration, Laws, Policies, Guidelines, Procedures, and Bilateral Treaties of HHIDM.

## **Local Ambassadors**

HHIDM may appoint one or more Ambassadors within countries where HHIDM maintains diplomatic activities, facilities, or treaty relationships.

Local Ambassadors shall coordinate activities within their assigned country and shall work in cooperation with the Ambassador-at-Large responsible for that region.

## **Diplomatic Reporting Structure**

Local Ambassadors shall report to the appropriate Ambassador-at-Large for their region.

Ambassadors-at-Large shall coordinate with the Minister of Foreign Affairs and other authorized HHIDM officials as required by established procedures.

## **Appointment Authority**

All diplomatic appointments shall be reviewed through the established HHIDM process and approved through the appropriate governing procedures of HHIDM.

## **School of Diplomacy**

HHIDM may establish Schools of Diplomacy, training programs, certification programs, seminars, workshops, and educational institutions for the training of diplomats, ambassadors, officers, interns, and government officials.

## **Mandatory Diplomatic Training**

No person shall be appointed as an Ambassador-at-Large, Ambassador, Diplomatic Officer, Government Officer, or Departmental Officer until successfully completing required HHIDM training programs.

### **Such training may include:**

- **Constitution**
- **Declaration**
- **Core Principles**
- **Core Values**
- **Laws**
- **Policies**
- **Guidelines**
- **Procedures**
- **Diplomatic Conduct**
- **International Protocol**
- **Departmental Responsibilities**
- **Administrative Procedures**

## **Ongoing Training**

Diplomatic representatives and officers may be required to participate in continuing education and refresher training programs to maintain familiarity with HHIDM laws, procedures, policies, and governance standards.
